

Recollection-1


Oil on canvas (size: $165 \text{ cm} \times 137 \text{ cm}$)

Salahuddin has already distinguished himself as an artist of the urbanscape. His third solo show in 1994 particularly depicted the many faces of the brick and mortar city. He was attracted by the lanes and bylanes and the buildings upon buildings, usually with no or very few people around. The technique he applied was a combination of brush strokes with scraping of the palette knife. His style was semi-realistic, with some element of surrealism, such as through the presence of a swinging ball. The atmosphere created in Salahuddin's cityscapes is that of a haunting world.

In this latest phase, as evident in the present solo exhibition, Salahuddin appears with a significantly transformed style. The urban image is still visible but only in a symbolic manner. The style has moved towards abstraction and minimization. From the tightly organized architectonic pattern, the canvas now has a lot of space, the colours are dominated by cool pleasant blues or soft pinks and mauves.

Personally I miss his city imagery but also feel quite enchanted by his soothingly romantic compositions in oil. Salahuddin is definitely moving ahead.


